# Who we are

**The archipelago of Madeira is a Portuguese archipelago made up of four groups of islands: Madeira, Porto Santo, Desertas and Selvagens. Its total area is 801 km<sup>2</sup>.**

Madeira and Porto Santo are the two main islands and the only inhabited ones. Approximately 251,000 people live here. The Desertas and Selvagens Islands are nature reserves and are the refuge of multiple species of fauna and flora, whose visit requires prior authorisation.



# Where we are

**The archipelago of Madeira is located in the North Atlantic Ocean on the African tectonic plate.**

It is approximately 1000 km from mainland Europe (about 1h30 flight from Lisbon) and 700 km from the African coast.





# How to get there

Cristiano Ronaldo International Airport, named after the Madeiran footballer, is the arrival point for most visitors to the archipelago of Madeira. Direct, daily flights to the main European airports and many more to the rest of the world on a weekly basis, turn visiting Madeira quicker and easier.

**Travelling to Madeira is, in most cases, a short trip from anywhere in Europe, making the region an ideal destination both for short breaks and long stays.**

Another large slice of the tourists visiting Madeira arrive by sea. Dozens of cruise ships arrive at the port of Funchal every week. It is not uncommon, therefore, for some of the largest passenger ships in the world to anchor in Funchal, thus placing Madeira in their stopovers all year round.

**It is also possible to visit the archipelago of Madeira by landing directly in Porto Santo. The golden island has an airport which, in addition to flights from Madeira and the mainland, receives charter flights from several European countries throughout the year.**





# Climate

**The archipelago of Madeira certainly has one of the most pleasant climates in all of Europe.**

**The monthly temperature varies slightly throughout the year. The archipelago of Madeira certainly has one of the most pleasant climates in all of Europe.**

**In Funchal - the capital of the archipelago - the temperature rarely drops below 17°C in winter (i.e. February) and rarely exceeds 25°C in summer (i.e. August).**

However, we find microclimates all over the island. The large mountains and the air currents that blow in from various directions make the climate different in each area of the archipelago. As a rule, the south is the hottest part of the island. When we go north, the temperature drops while in the interior of the island, in the high-altitude areas, the temperatures drop gradually and precipitation is more frequent...

**It is therefore possible, in a short walk around the island, to enjoy the sensation of having lived through the four seasons in a single day.**



# Safety

Madeira is a safe destination, ideal for a holiday with the family (even with children and babies), or among friends. Nothing is too far away and you can experience a lot in a few days. The tranquillity is ideal for those who want to relax and escape from the daily routine. With a very low crime rate, a holiday in the archipelago is synonymous with peace of mind and body.

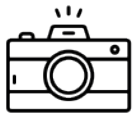


# Sea

**Seen from the archipelago, the horizon seems endless, where it is difficult to distinguish the sea from the sky. An idyllic setting responsible for the feeling of serenity and tranquillity that few places offer.**

The moments of union with nature give us the opportunity to experience, first-hand, the beauty, peace and power of the Atlantic Ocean, which, all along the coast, has created pebble beaches - eternal meeting points with the sea that the Madeirans have learnt to inhabit.

The average temperature of the sea water in the archipelago of Madeira is relatively high and varies regularly throughout the year, between around 17° C in March and 22° C in August and September. These values make the islands ideal places, not only for bathing all year round, but also for enjoying a great diversity of water sports.



# Beaches of Madeira

A great diversity of beaches can be found along the coast of Madeira. The beaches of Madeira are known for their pebbles.

**From north to south of the island, there are many beaches that remain untouched by humans.**

Little-explored corners make up scenarios of unspoilt natural beauty, ideal for those who value peace and quiet and the tranquillity of being almost alone with the natural elements.

On the other hand, the bathing complexes found almost in every municipality are an excellent option for those who want to swim in the crystal blue sea of Madeira, with the comfort of a lounge where you can spread your towel and benefit from facilities such as a bar service, changing rooms and good accessibility to the sea.

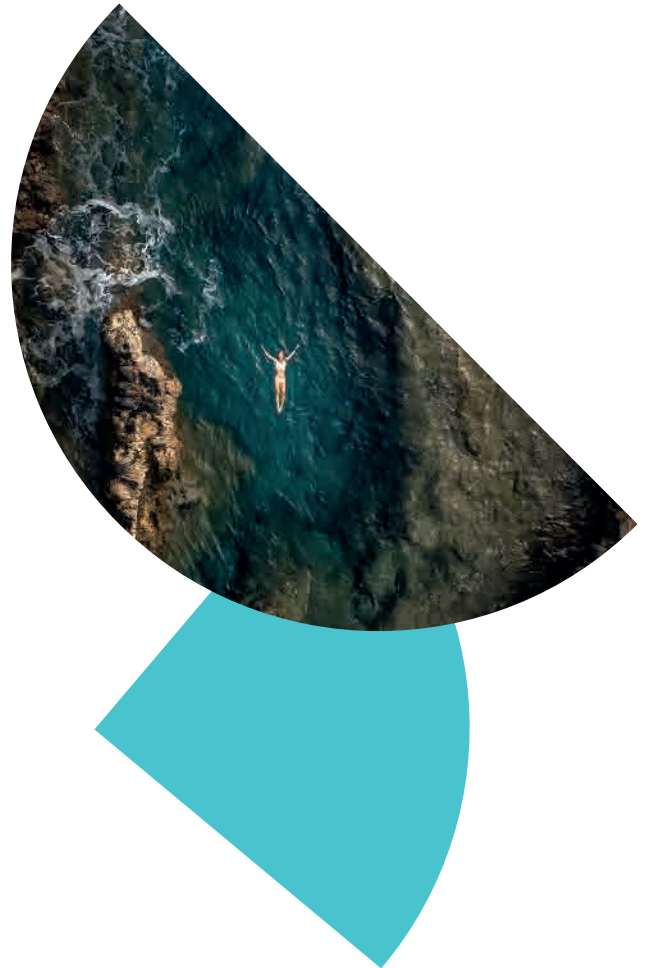
Less common, and therefore very appealing, are the sandy beaches. Black, coppery or golden, all paradisiacal destinations, when it comes to choosing where to go bathing, sandy beaches are the choice of many families and holidaymakers.



# Natural volcanic pools

The natural pools of Porto Moniz and Seixal are saltwater pools that, framed by volcanic rock, are naturally fed by the sea. Located on the north coast of Madeira, these pools are considered one of the island's natural treasures. The sea water, which is cyclically renewed in the volcanic rocks, is combined with the green landscape of the mountains, combining the earth and water elements in an idyllic perfection.

Also on the south coast of Madeira, we can find traces of this type of natural volcanic contribution. In Funchal, at the Bathing Area of Poças do Gomes/Doca do Cavacas, it's possible to swim in natural volcanic pools, while at the same time beholding the incredible and imposing sight of Cabo Girão - the highest promontory in Europe, at 580 metres.





# Active tourism and water sports

The mild climate and favourable sea temperature of Madeira create conditions for outdoor activities and sports at any time of the year.

**From the most radical to the most relaxing, the deep blue that bathes the entire coastline of Madeira is prone to unforgettable adventures.**

From surfing to diving, without forgetting boat trips and whale watching, the sea that surrounds the archipelago is a privileged space for international swimming, sailing and canoeing competitions.

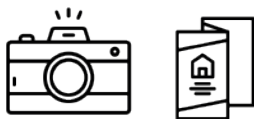

# Nature

**Our Nature, with its incomparable beauty, is responsible for the vivid images of colour and movement that dazzle all who visit Madeira.**

The incredible scenery awakens the senses and makes you want to be in constant communion with the thousand shades of green that dot every corner of the island.





# Laurissilva Forest



**The Laurissilva Forest is the indigenous forest of Madeira with humid subtropical characteristics and occupies 20% of the island.**

It was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1999 and walking through it is one of the highlights of any trip to the archipelago. It is mainly composed of trees and shrubs with evergreen foliage, especially the Madeira laurel, the Madeira mahogany, the laurel tree and the Canary laurel - all from the Lauraceae family.

# Madeira Nature Park

**The Madeira Nature Park is a biogenetic reserve whose entire area encompasses unique flora and fauna.**

Officially created in 1982, this protected area occupies 2/3 of the island's territory and includes all of its municipalities, from east to west, more significantly in the centre and north coast of the region. The best way to explore it is by using the network of recommended routes, to be dazzled by the incredible natural scenery that you'll encounter.



# Levadas

**Levadas are irrigation channels created to direct water from the northern slopes of the island, where it is more abundant because of the rain, to the south.** An engineering project developed by Madeirans over several centuries and successive generations, the levada network is around 1400 km long. To walk these trails is to be rewarded by landscapes of perfect authenticity, witnessing the ancestral power of nature shaped over thousands of years.

# Viewpoints

From cosmopolitan movement to tropical nature, the viewpoints built across the Region offer unique and memorable panoramic views. These are marked by the unavoidable presence of the sea and the vegetation, which gives green tones to practically every corner.

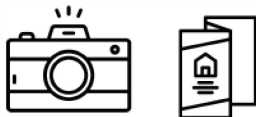




# Funchal

**Funchal is the capital of the Island of Madeira and is located in a bay on the south coast of the island. A bustling, cosmopolitan place, it shines resplendent from the natural amphitheatre where it rests, surrounded by mountains and valleys. A perfect balance between nature and urbanism, walking around Funchal is like collecting unique experiences.**

Around 100,000 people live in the ten parishes that make up the Municipality of Funchal, which has an area of approximately 77km<sup>2</sup>.





## Mercado dos Lavradores (Farmers' Market)

One of the landmarks of the capital of Madeira is a place where colours, aromas and tradition come together to welcome and amaze visitors in a truly incomparable experience.

Situated in the historical area of Funchal, the Mercado dos Lavradores was inaugurated in 1940 and for many years has been the main supply centre of the region.

Nowadays, it continues to be the choice of many Madeirans when it comes to buying the most exotic fruits, as well as fish and seafood, which arrive fresh every day at the market.

## Basket Sledges

In Madeira the fun is literally around the corner. When you go up to the parish of Monte, you get to know one of Madeira's most famous attractions. **Basket sledges are a very original form of transport, a tradition drawing its origins in the 19th century.** Nowadays they are a mandatory tourist activity for those who want to relive part of the once common way of travelling from Monte to downtown Funchal.

## Funchal Downtown

It is believed that this was the first area of the city of Funchal to be populated. Since the implementation of the 'Arte das Portas Abertas' project in 2010, the number of people has multiplied and this part of the city has become one of the main gastronomic and entertainment centres of Funchal.

## Entertainment

In Funchal, entertainment takes place all year round. The mild weather means that many of the parties and events can be held outdoors without major constraints. The events calendar offers local people and visitors alike plenty of reasons to celebrate and toast together. Also the multiplicity of bars, discos, rooftops and restaurants gives Funchal a unique liveliness.

# Heritage and Culture



With more than 600 years of History, the archipelago of Madeira is proud to be the guardian of a vast collection of monuments, religious temples, museums and other cultural spaces. Madeira's cultural heritage therefore stands out for its diversity and, of course, for its undeniable historical relevance.

## History

It was 1419 when the island of Madeira was added to the map by Portuguese navigators, a year after they had named the island of Porto Santo.

The archipelago's colonisation process began in 1425.

In the following centuries, Madeira's history is inevitably defined firstly by sugar cane cultivation, then by the exporting of Madeira wine.

Already in the 19th century, some of the European aristocracy, attracted by the archipelago's therapeutic properties, began to take up temporary residence here.

Madeira flourished for tourism, a sector that still marks its daily pulse today.



## **Monuments and Architecture**

Madeira's heritage includes buildings from different historical periods and architectural styles, ranging from Baroque to Manueline, including Gothic, Rococo and Mannerist. The Churches of Madeira are probably among the best examples, standing out not only for their relevant architecture but also for their rich and elaborate interiors.

Visit, for example, the Funchal Cathedral and the Colégio Church, but also look out for the palaces, forts and museums scattered around the archipelago.

## **Gardens and Parks**

Madeira is also famous for the beauty of its gardens and parks. Centenary trees, peculiar plants and exuberant flowers dot both the municipal gardens and the charming Madeiran manor houses, some of which are open to the public.

Tropical and botanical gardens have seduced locals and visitors for decades and represent meeting points with nature, even in more urban environments.

## **Madeira Embroidery**

With a secular history, Madeira Embroidery is synonymous with excellence, tradition, detail, art and identity. It is one of the unquestionable trademarks of this Atlantic archipelago, whose origin dates back to the beginning of its settlement process, in the 15th century.

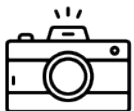


# Porto Santo

**Porto Santo is the second largest island in the archipelago of Madeira and, apart from the Island of Madeira, is the only other inhabited island in the archipelago. In 2020 it was awarded the UNESCO Biosphere Reserve status, with the entire island and the surrounding marine area.**

True to its name, Porto Santo is a sacred refuge for all who visit. This paradise, situated only 50 km from the Island of Madeira, is known for its beautiful long stretch of golden sand, which occupies practically the entire south coast of the island. Relaxation is guaranteed by the 9 km of a generous beach that, in 2022, was voted by European Best Destinations as the best beach in Europe. However, Porto Santo has much more to offer. Peaks and trails invite you to go into nature, and the sea, slightly undulating, is ideal for nautical activities such as windsurfing. Porto Santo's gastronomy deserves a chapter of its own.

With an airport that receives daily flights from several European countries and a port that every day welcomes a ferry from Funchal, connecting the two islands, Porto Santo is the ideal refuge, accessible to everyone, and a destination worth visiting on its own or in combination with Madeira.



# The sandy beaches



The sand from Porto Santo is carbonated and biogenic, possessing physical, chemical and thermal properties that have proven successful in naturopathic processes. Together with the sea that bathes its coast, the richness in iodine, calcium and magnesium contribute to solving the lack of mineral salts.

**For two centuries, the sands of Porto Santo have been used to treat rheumatic, psychiatric and orthopaedic illnesses.** In this regard, Porto Santo is also considered a destination associated with wellness and well-being, and a stay on the golden island is ideal for connecting body and senses.

# Active Tourism



**The island of Porto Santo offers the possibility of engaging in a wide variety of activities and sports, in communion with nature.** On land, there are walks along incredible trails, excursions to steep peaks, 4x4 trips, and amateur or professional golf in an oasis for golf lovers at Porto Santo Golf Course. The sea around Porto Santo is perfect for whale watching, diving and snorkelling, and for activities such as surfing, windsurfing and stand-up paddling. Its mild temperature makes it possible to dive in the sea without hesitation all year round.

# Events



# Unforgettable events



**Madeira proudly presents a calendar of events with activities taking place all year round and covering a wide variety of themes. Cultural, traditional, sport or in honour of Nature, these events are planned so that those who visit the archipelago take home memories of celebration.**

## Carnival

In Madeira, Carnival is celebrated over two weeks of festivities, bringing together all the activities that, over the years, have established themselves as tradition, and served to build the reputation of 'great revellers' that Madeirans boast with great pride. A big contribution to this is the Grand Carnival Parade, which takes place on the Saturday before Shrove Tuesday and transforms the main avenues of Funchal into a Madeiran sambadrome. Music, choreography, glitter and boldness add glamour to a night that extends through the streets and nightlife venues of the region.



## Flower Festival

**The celebration of spring and nature is one of Madeira's main tourist attractions.**

The archipelago is transformed into a stage that hosts beautiful floral displays spread on its floor and plenty of entertainment along its avenues, with musical concerts, shows, fashion shows and classic car exhibitions among others. The highlight of this festivity is, however, the Allegoric Flower Parade that crosses the main avenues of Funchal with dozens of floats, decorated with the beautiful Madeiran flowers, while thousands of participants, especially children, parade to the sound of joyful symphonies, wearing beautiful costumes, also representing the flower.



## Atlantic Festival

**The Atlantic Festival announces the beginning of summer in the archipelago of Madeira.**

During the month of June, several cultural initiatives take place in the open air. It is in this context that the Regional Arts Week takes place, as well as the oldest World Music festival in Portugal: 'Raízes do Atlântico'. However, the high point of this celebration is the pyromusical shows that take place every Saturday of the month, organised by different guest countries.

## **Wine Festival**

**The end of summer is celebrated in Madeira with the Wine Festival. An event that celebrates not only wine itself, but also grapes and the grape harvest.**

For two weeks, the party takes place in the avenues of Funchal, where you find wine tastings and allusive spaces and even a Wine Lounge will be set up. The activities of the Wine Festival invite tourists and Madeirans to participate in the process of the grape harvest, from picking to treading the grapes. A festival which, as could not be otherwise, also exalts the famous Madeira Wine.

## **Columbus Festival**

**The Columbus Festival is held on the island of Porto Santo in September and commemorates the passage of navigator Christopher Columbus through the island, where he lived from 1478 to 1480.** Every year, Porto Santo embraces this tradition and embarks on a faithful reconstruction of medieval daily life. The festival features dramatisations, theatrical performances, acrobatics and juggling; entertainment is a constant in the city's streets.

This festival is a journey back in time that is worth experiencing, while enjoying the many other reasons that bring so many tourists to this golden paradise every year.

## **Nature Festival**

**This event in the tourist calendar aims to promote tourist entertainment as part of Nature, encouraging the practice of sports activities in direct contact with the natural heritage of Madeira.**

For one week, the centre of Funchal will host demonstrations of activities that can be done both in nature and at sea, promoting some of the sports that benefit most from the natural environment of the region. From hiking to diving, canoeing to mountain biking, Madeira celebrates the fact that it is one of today's top destinations for active tourism.

# Christmas and New Year

**The month of December in Madeira is marked by Christmas – the favourite celebration of all Madeirans – even gaining the nickname of 'The Festivity'.**

Thousands of multicoloured bulbs light up and illuminate the outside of the streets in all the parishes of Madeira, in a show of light and colour that can only be compared to the joy that Madeirans and tourists alike show on their faces at this time of year.

In Funchal, the epicentre of the Christmas festivities, gastronomic tastings take place and entertainment runs along the city's avenues and squares, contributing to a constant climate of fun, culture and Christmas spirit. The authenticity of the Madeiran Christmas has even granted it entry to the list of the Best Christmas Markets in Europe, in 2022, by European Best Destinations. New Year's Eve and the first few minutes of January bring us a display of light and colour that has already made history in the Guinness World Records as the largest fireworks display in the world and that, every year, contributes to entering the New Year with beauty and hope.

# Awards and distinctions

**The islands of the archipelago of Madeira have received several distinctions over the years, both nationally and internationally, placing the archipelago at the top of world tourist destinations.**

Madeira has consecutively won the award for best island destination in the world, awarded by the World Travel Awards, since 2015 and also received the award for best island destination in Europe by the same entity in 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021.

Other notable awards include the award given by the World Golf Awards in 2019 which chose Madeira as the best emerging golf destination in the world.

The Guinness World Records gave Madeira the distinction of Largest Fireworks Display in the World, for the fireworks of the year 2006/2007.

Since 2020 the Christmas Market of Madeira has been mentioned in the European top 10.

Two of the three best beaches in Europe are in Madeira, according to Best European Destinations, and are located in Porto Santo and Seixal.

Due to the concern with the planet's sustainability and its measures' implementation, the Autonomous Region of Madeira was awarded the distinction of 'Sustainable Tourism Destination' with the Silver Award, by EarthCheck.
